
TRANSITION FROM 6TH TO 7TH

<u>Our Goal</u>: To make it as smooth as possible!

We know this can be a scary time with anxiety

for both students **AND** parents.

- Transition IEP meetings
- Elementary School visits
- Elementary teacher visit
 - Observe classes, see transitions, help prepare their students
- MS counselor visit elementary schools



TRANSITION FROM 7TH TO 8TH

Teachers and case managers are in the process of giving recommendations/ proposals

- Annual IEP's are in process
- Schedules finalized and available in August

All Students:

• We spend much of the summer ensuring students have all the courses they need based upon teacher recommendations and IEP proposals

- We aim to have case managers be one of the student's teachers
- Families will be contacted by case managers within the first 2 weeks of school

CASE MANAGERS

- Assist all teachers in understanding of the IEP.
- Resource person for student's disability or needs.
- Conducts IEP meetings.
- Communicates quarterly progress of IEP goals.
- Communicates with students and parents

LEVELS OF SERVICES

- AAP/Honors
- General Education
- Team-taught
 - 2 teachers, large class size, follows VA standards and pacing guides
- Self -contained
 - 1 teacher, sometimes Instructional Assistant, smaller class size, follows VA standards and pacing guides, all students receive special education services
- Intellectual Disabilities Severe Site
 - Students accessing the adapted curriculum/VESOLs

Class placements & services are determined at IEP meetings

An IEP meeting can be called at anytime to discuss placement options

SPECIAL EDUCATION ELECTIVES

- Course selection sheets for elective preferences
- Options need to be considered within the IEP process
 - At the annual or transition IEP

Strategies for Success



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT (PD)

This course is designed to address social and emotional behaviors that impact academic progress, but not student academic deficits.

- Social skills instruction is a positive, proactive intervention
- Teach specific social behavior to promote student success in the school and community.
- Current research identifies five dimensions of social skills for adolescents: peer relations, self-management, academics, compliance, and assertion.
- Self-contained setting

STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS

- Opportunity for support with Executive Functioning Skills/ Academic Supports/Time management
- Success can depend on if the student would be willing to access help/bring materials/etc.
- Self-contained setting



This course is designed to provide direct, explicit and intensive reading instruction to students with disabilities who are <u>reading significantly below grade level.</u>

• Instruction focuses on decoding, fluency and comprehension skills of fiction and nonfiction materials

• Based on the diagnosis of each student's needs as outlined through the student's Individual Education Program (IEP).

• All small group instruction, research based programs and direct instruction

FOR STUDENTS CURRENTLY ACCESSING AN ADAPTIVE CURRICULUM AND SUPPORTS

- Intellectual Disabilities Severe site
- Adapted curriculum instruction for all core content areas (English, Math, Social Studies and Science)
- Adapted PE
- Life Skills/Work Awareness & Transition (WAT) electives
- Community Based Instruction (CBI)
- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)
- Reverse Inclusion
