-all take the same core or required classes together

Middle School


-have 7 (maybe more!) different teachers and periods, each class has different mix of students

-have elective class that support the transition to middle school, develop skills, and explore topics that may be new to you

-many after school clubs, activities, and academic support

<u>Honors is not "all or nothing."</u>

- You can take honors in any core class you have an interest in, or no honors.
- You can begin honors any year, 7th, 8th, 9th, or change your mind.
 - For example, you can take English Honors in 7th THEN switch to English in 8th
- Middle School is the ideal time to try Honors.
- It depends on what is right for YOU.







Advanced Classes

- Increased depth and complexity
- Student who are eligible for full time Advanced Academics can continue receiving services in the Center at KJMS.
- Students and families can select Honors classes in areas of strength or interest
- Students may enroll in 1, 2, 3, or 4 Honors courses.




There is no right or wrong choice.
